A NOTE FROM FATHER JOHN

POPE BENEDICT XVI ON THE EPIPHANY: The wise men followed the star. Through the language of creation, they discovered the God of history, To be sure - the language of creation alone is not enough. Only God's word, which we encounter is sacred Scripture, was able to mark out their path definitively, Creation and Scripture, reason and faith, must come together, so as to lead us forward to the living God. There has been much discussion over what kind of star it was that the wise men were following. Some suggest a planetary constellation, or a supernova, that is to say one of those stars that is initially quite weak, in which an inner explosion releases a brilliant light for a certain time, or a comet, etc. This debate we may leave to the experts. The real star, the true supernova that leads us on, is Christ himself. He is as it were the explosion of God's love, which causes the great white light of his heart to shine upon the world. And we may add: the wise men from the East, who feature in today's Gospel, like all the saints, have themselves gradually become constellations of God that mark out the path. In all these people, being touched by God's word has, as it were, released an explosion of light, through which God's radiance shines upon our world and shows us the path. The saints are stars of God, by whom we let ourselves be led to him for whom our whole being longs.

THE EPIPHANY BLESSING is the traditional way of invoking the Lord's protection upon your home and individual areas in your house. We have blessed chalk and instructions with the prayer that is to be offered. If you are interested in this, packets are available in the gathering area.

DEACON JIM'S "A MOMENT WITH OUR LADY" January 7, 2024

At the age of twelve Mary the Egyptian ran away from her parents to the city of Alexandria. Here she lived an extremely dissolute life, causing scandal around her. After 17 years of this life, it took her fancy, in mockery, to accompany a group of pilgrims to Jerusalem, where they were going to celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Once there, Mary tried to enter the Church of the Holy Sepulcher for the celebration, out of curiosity, but she was barred from doing so by an unseen force. She realized that she could not enter God's house because her impurity.

There was an image of the Blessed Virgin under the porch of the church. Prostrating herself before the Virgin, the young sinner prayed: "O Mother of God, have mercy on the wretch I am! Refuge of Sinners do not deny me the consolation of seeing and worshiping the sacred wood on which your Son, my Savior, has shed his blood to redeem me. I promise you to go do penance for my crimes wherever you want."

The sinner was then able to enter and prostrate herself before the Holy Cross. Asking the Blessed Virgin, "Where do you want me to go now?" A voice answered, "If you cross the Jordan, you will find glorious rest."

Mary of Egypt confessed her sins, received Holy Communion, and retired to the desert beyond the Jordan. She lived there for 47 years. A priest, Saint Zozimas, brought her communion every year on the same date. When she died, he found her body surrounded by light, and these words written on the sand next to her: "Bury the body of the poor sinner Mary here, and pray for the repose of her soul.

Duties include arrival at 8:30 pm for room setup, greeting & registering guests, distributing cots/blankets/pillows, communicating Warming Center rules, listening, providing supervision, packing & storing cots & bedding, & working with guests to clean the room in the morning. Volunteers will be able to sleep if they wish. Individuals may volunteer weekly, biweekly, or monthly. To place your name on their volunteer list, please submit to the Rectory your name, phone number, email address, the number of times you would like to volunteer, & the day or days of the week that work best for you. This information will be submitted to the Warming Center Committee.
